MEDIA DOWNLOADS

Downloadable eBooks, Audiobooks, Magazines, Classes, & more







All Harvard Diggins Library cardholders have access to Libby, an online digital resource that offers free downloadable e-books (in ePub, Kindle, or PDF formats), audiobooks (in MP3 or WMA formats), magazines, and streaming videos. These digital materials check-out just like library books, and automatically delete from your device after the loan period has expired. Under Libby, Harvard Diggins Library is part of Online Media of Northern Illinois (or "OMNI Libraries")

Libby is compatible with most devices that connect to the internet. You can access Libby from your smartphone, tablet, or computer. The Libby app is available in the Google Play Store, the App Store for iOS, in the Amazon App Store, and in the Windows App Store for PCs with Windows 8 or higher. Users can download the materials to their device, or read the books directly in the web browser. Libby replaces the app previously known as "Overdrive".

You can check out, renew, and place holds on items from anywhere, 24/7. All you need is a device, an internet connection, and a library card.

LOAN PERIODS

E-books, digital audiobooks, and magazines can be checked out from Libby for 7-21 days. Streaming videos can be checked out for 3-7 days. Checkouts will automatically be removed from your account and deleted from your devices once your selected borrowing period has expired—no late fees! Cardholders can have up to five titles checked out at a time. A renew option (or "request again" option, if the checked out title has holds) will appear in the last 3 days of the loan period.

For items that are checked out to another patron, you can be put on a waiting list for up to six items. Once the item is available, you must check it out within 3 days or it will be given to the next person in line.

Streaming videos expire 48 hours after the first play.

GETTING STARTED WITH LIBBY

To begin using Libby, you can either download the Libby app from your app store, or use your web browser and go to www.omnilibraries.org.

If you are using the Libby app, follow the prompts to set up the app and search for "Harvard Diggins Library".




You will see Harvard Diggins Library available under "Online Media of Northern Illinois Libraries". Use your library card barcode and PIN to log in (if you do not have a PIN, you can set one up at the Circulation Desk).


If you prefer to read with the Kindle app, you can set up Libby to open your borrowed books directly in the Kindle app.

FINDING BOOKS ON LIBBY - OMNILIBRARIES

To find books on Libby, you can either search by title or author, or you can browse by genres and reading formats (categories).



You can also browse via the Kids or Teens collections:



BORROWING ITEMS IN LIBBY

Once you have found a title you want to borrow, hover over or tap on the cover, select your preferred loan period, and click on "Borrow". If the title is checked out to someone else, you can click on "Place a Hold" and be put on a waiting list for that item.

To read the title, go to your account to see your checkouts. You can quickly read, listen, or watch your items right in your web browser (with an internet connection) by clicking on "Read in Your Browser" or by downloading the appropriate file format for your device to be able to read on the go.



Compatible e-book and audiobook formats vary by device. For example, Kindle users will authorize e-book downloads through their Amazon account and download the Kindle version to their devices, or use the Kindle app. iOS and Android users might find it easiest to use the Libby app. Windows users might prefer a PDF version of the book you checked out. You can access a list of your downloaded titles in the Libby app by clicking on "Bookshelf". If you have any questions about downloading items to your device, please don't hesitate to ask library staff. We can help you determine the easiest and most convenient way to read eBooks and listen to audiobooks with your device!

BiblioBoard is an eBook service available to anyone in Illinois; no library card required. It has nearly 40,000 items available to anyone in the state, and the items are always available no waiting lists.

EREAD ILLINOIS

Library cardholders in Illinois now have access to a NEW service for downloading eBooks and audiobooks called eRead Illinois. This service is frequently updated with new popular books and in all including children's aenres. books, young adult books, and books for Spanish readers.

BORROWING ON A MOBILE DEVICE

Items on eRead Illinois check out for 2 weeks. You can easily manage and listen to your eRead Illinois downloads on your mobile device. Previously, the eRead Illinois platform was available on a mobile app called "Axis360" but will be moved to a new app called "Boundless" in September 2023. This app is available in the Apple app store for those with iOS 13 and above and the Google Play store for those with Android 9 and above. If your device does not yet have these software updates, you will need to update your device before using Boundless.
